Fostering Self Esteem

Lesson #6

This lesson focuses on the aspect of dignity, a synonym for self-esteem. Self-respect is what underlies this program; we respect our personhood, our relationship with the Creator.

What is the difference between having good self-esteem and being self-centered? Older children can be invited to explore this question. How will having a sense of personal dignity help someone to be a faithful Christian? Invite the children into the story of St. Francis of Assisi. One part of his story tells us he took off all his clothes in the village street! Why?

The story of our Lord's passion and death is the story of a scandal, a complete loss of personal dignity. Yet it is also the story of our salvation. How do you view it?
