Introducing the Concept of Luring

Lesson #2

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that "the living and true God tirelessly calls each person". (CCC: 2567)

Lures call to fish and to children. We have contrasted lures with the call of God to each and every one of us through our Baptism. What we need to do is heed that call and respond to it. A number of the children hearing this will have had experience with fishing. It should be possible to help them to understand the concept through their experience. The added use of a fishing rod with lures will help them to make the connection.

The Psalm reminds us that we need to listen for the Word of God in our lives. St. Paul is a dramatic model for us. Usually the call does not come so dramatically. Jesus gathered his apostles by personal invitation, inviting them into his mission. The mission was made clear to them gradually. Jesus used the details of everyday life to "reveal the Father's love and man's sublime calling..." (Gaudium et Spes: 32,1965)

Many parishes use Catechetical Sunday as an opportunity to commission or bless those ministering in the faith formation programs; this also often serves as a time to call people to this ministry.
