We are not able to do this for ourselves; 'self-medicating' to avoid life's problems does no one any good.

In the Philadelphia area, they have the wonderful example of Alex's Lemonade Stand. Older children may make the connection with Dr. Martin Luther King's example which helped to heal a grave ill within our nation.

Church Teachings	<p>CCC 1503: <i>Christ's compassion toward the sick & his healings...are a resplendent sign that ...the Kingdom of God is close at hand.</i></p> <p>1505: <i>But he did not heal all the sick. His healings were signs of the coming of the Kingdom...They announced... the victory over sin & death through his Passover...Christ took upon himself the whole weight of evil...took away the sin of the world, of which illness is only a consequence.</i></p> <p>1506: <i>By following him they acquire a new outlook on illness and the sick.</i></p> <p>1508: <i>The Holy Spirit gives to some a special charism of healing....But even the most intense prayer does not always obtain the healing of all illnesses.</i></p> <p>1509: <i>The Church has received this charge (heal the sick)from the Lord....She believes in the life-giving presence of Christ, the physician of souls and bodies...particularly active through the sacraments....through the Eucharist, the bread that gives eternal life....</i></p> <p>1511: <i>...among the seven sacraments there is one especially intended to those being tried by illness, the Anointing of the Sick...</i></p> <p>2211: <i>The political community has a duty to honor the family, to assist it & to ensure especially:...the protection of security & health, especially with respect to dangers like drugs, pornography,...,etc</i></p> <p>2288: <i>Life & physical health are precious gifts entrusted to us by God. We must take reasonable care of them...</i></p> <p>2291: <i>The use of drugs inflicts very grave damage on human health & life...except on strictly therapeutic grounds...</i></p>
