## **Assistance Lure**

### **Lesson #8**

The intention of this lesson is to help the children see the good that we can be part of by helping people. A wonderful example of this comes to us in Luke's account of the Good Samaritan.

All of us are called to help others in this life. John's gospel tells us the story of Jesus' showing this to the apostles at the Last Supper when he washed their feet. Service is what we are to be about as Christians. All believers are capable of helping someone, no matter what their age or situation in life.

Dorothy Day and St. Vincent de Paul are only two of many examples of people who answered the call to help. Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta is another. The children can be invited to think about their own experiences. Depending on their age they may be conscious of their own answer to this call. They may be able to identify people in their own communities, schools, or families who they will be able to help in some way.

The preferential option for the poor reflects the teachings of Christ: "Our Lord warns us that we shall be separated from him if we fail to meet the serious needs of the poor and the little ones who are his brethren." (CCC) 'Whatever you do for the least of my brethren' (Mt 25:40)
