The Holy Father has asked that the faithful be given opportunities to deepen their understanding of and their participation in the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. MercyWorks (which is still being developed) will provide parishes with suggested activities that can be undertaken by individuals, families, schools, religious education classes, youth groups, other parish groups and parishes as a whole to do just that. In addition, specific diocesan days of action and other events will be organized.

Once the activity sheets are completed they will be posted on the Diocesan Website under the Jubilee of Mercy.
